City-Wide Graffiti Remediation Initiative
Released by Chief Michael Schirling

Burlington Police, Burlington's Center for Community and Neighborhood's, the QUEEN CITY POLICE FOUNDATION, and the BURLINGTON BUSINESS ASSOCIATION Team up for Graffiti Removal

Press Conference to be held Thursday April 16, 2009 at 1:00 p.m. – Burlington Police Department's Kevin P. Scully Community Room

1st Cleanup Day to coincide with Earth Day – April 22, 2009 – Volunteers should meet at the Burlington Police Station at 9:00 a.m. for graffiti removal training and team assignments.

2nd Cleanup Day to coincide with Green Up Day – May 2, 2009 – Volunteers should meet at the Burlington Police Station at 8:30 a.m. for graffiti removal training and team assignments.

Over the past year we have seen an increase in the amount of graffiti and a commensurate decrease in the removal of graffiti citywide. In response to that, enforcement efforts have been dramatically stepped up and the City's Graffiti Removal Team has been revitalized for the spring. A host of arrests have been made to date and more are expected shortly. Efforts to remove as much graffiti as quickly as possible will begin March 16, 2009.

Two key partners in this effort have stepped up to assist in graffiti remediation by helping to fund the specialized products and paint necessary to remove or paint over the graffiti that has become so pervasive in our area. The QUEEN CITY POLICE FOUNDATION and the BURLINGTON BUSINESS ASSOCIATION have teamed up to purchase the initial round of supplies and equipment needed to further this effort. In total, more than \$4,000 has been spent on or pledged to the effort so far.
